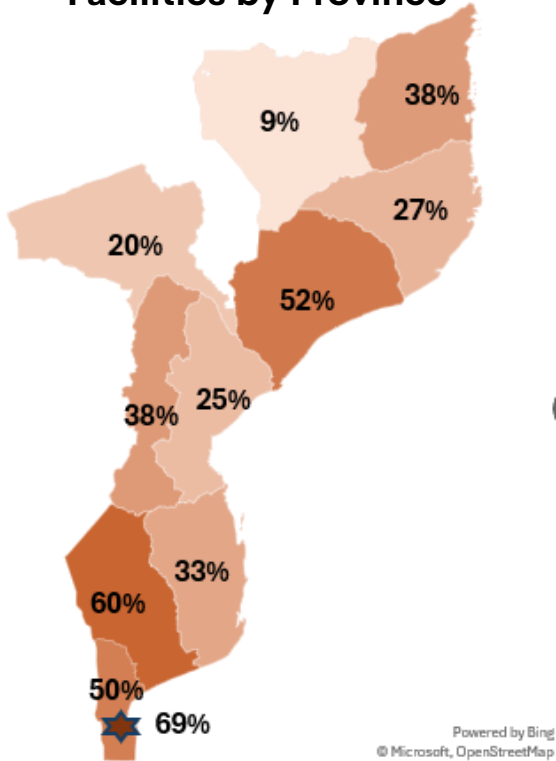

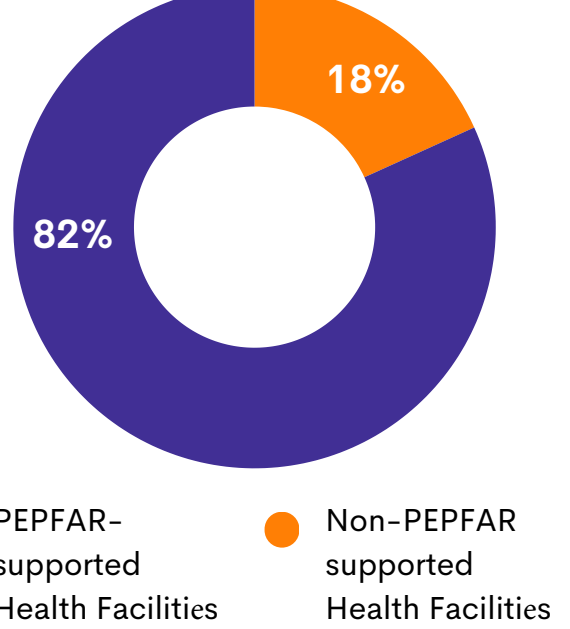

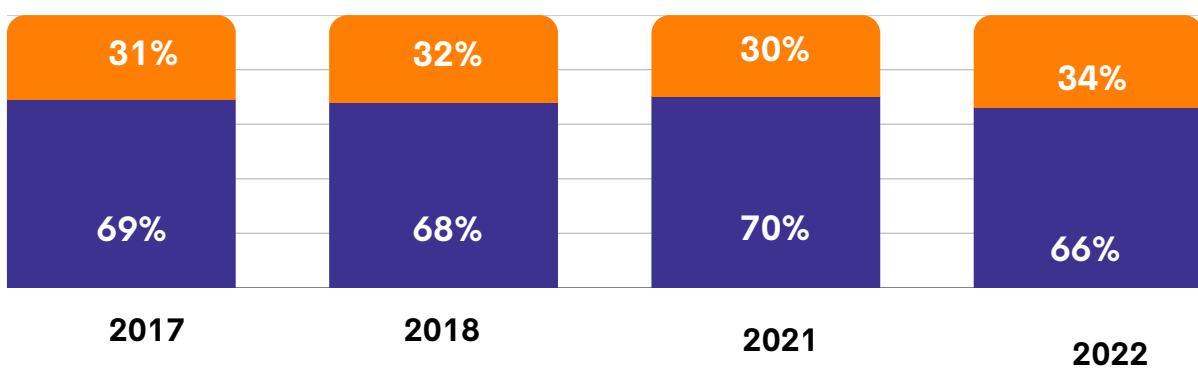

Legend: ■ % Financed by PEPFAR, ■ % Financed by other sources (domestic and international)



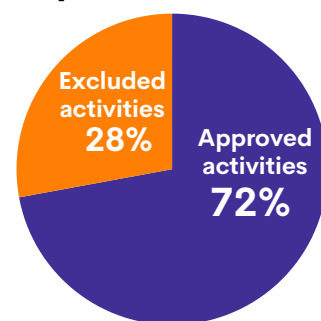
In 2022, PEPFAR's contribution to total expenditures was US\$355.5 million

## PEPFAR-funded activities impacted by Stop Work Orders

### Excluded activities (\$90.6 million)

- HIV Prevention, including for
  - Adolescent girls and young women
  - Voluntary Medical Male Circumcision
  - Population groups at high risk of HIV transmission (Key populations)
- Capacity-building for health workers
- Social and economic support for orphans and vulnerable children
- Strategic planning, coordination and policy development
- Community Mobilization
- Studies and Surveillance
- Human Rights programs
- Gender-based violence reduction



### Approved activities (\$272 million)

- HIV Care & Treatment
- HIV Testing services
- TB Prevention and Treatment
- Laboratory
- Procurement and Supply Chain
- Prevention of Mother to Child HIV Transmission
- PrEP (pregnant and breastfeeding women, only)
